

#### Key Features


- •Sets of data
- •A number of independent controls:
  - Map view (location and zoom)
  - Two sliders to control time:
    - Map slider
    - Person slider
    - Sliders can be synced either at low end or high end




### Example of Africa in 1900 (left) and 2002 (right)






#### Map View

Can show historically-correct map with or without present-day overlay






#### Slider to move through historical maps
