Capture what you find in pedigree charts and family group sheets. Use downloadable paper forms, an online tree, or genealogy software. Whatever works











Analysis Hint

- Which one of these is the best match for all the census info you've discovered so far?
- Are the parents' names a match?

- In other words, analysis hints to teach users to notice details in each record beyond name, date, and relationship.
- Additional hints could ask similar questions about whether it matches other records' details
