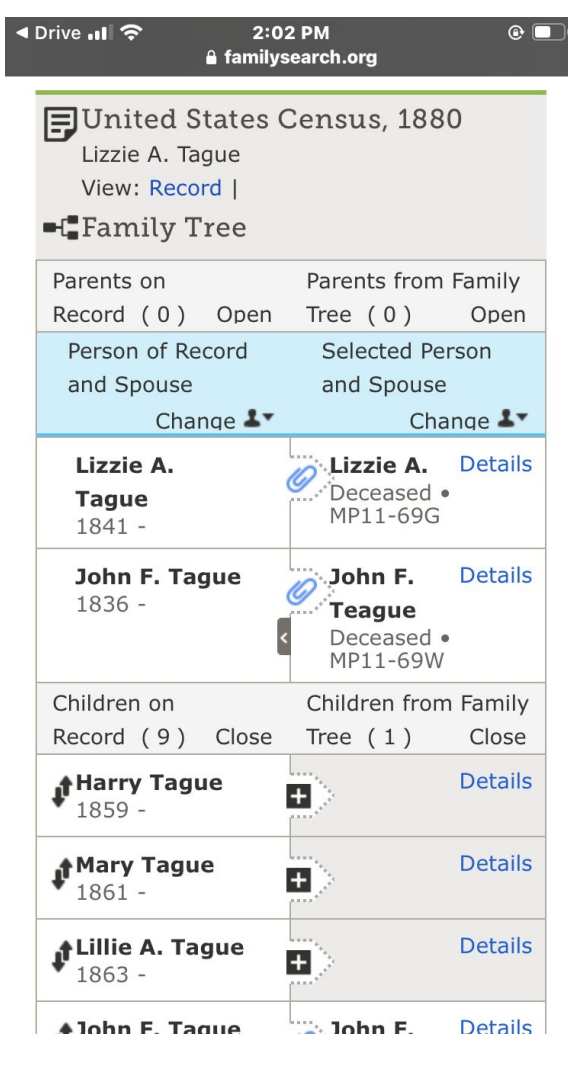
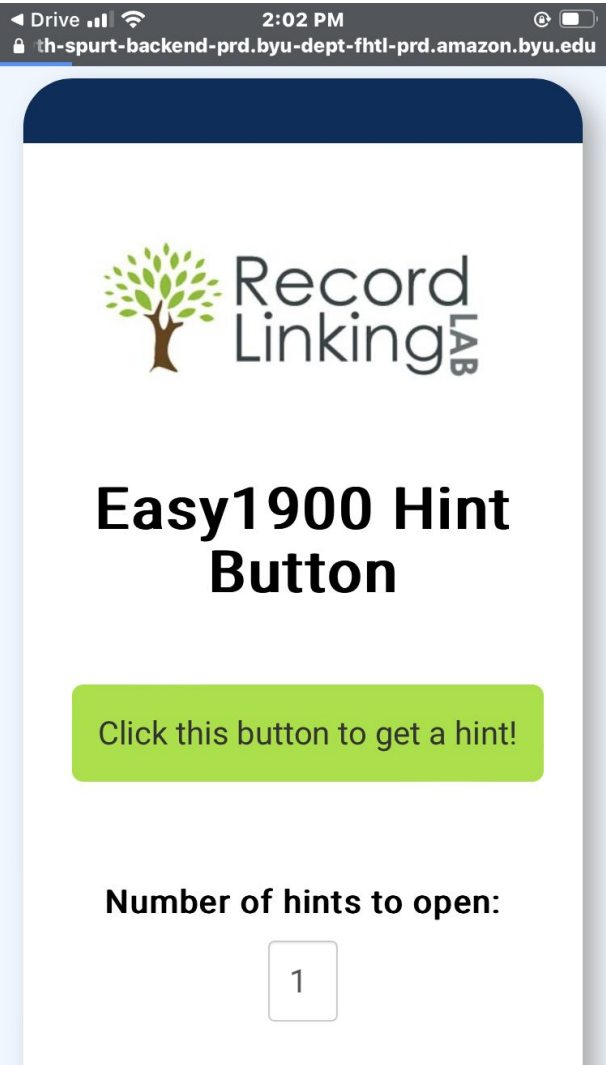

- Ideas for the project began in October of last year
- The 200 Pathways students that are currently involved in the project are from eight different African countries and Papua New Guinea
- In November of last year, students at the Record Linking Lab spent a few weeks putting together the initial training materials
- The project went live on
- November 30th



- Students are currently doing source linking tasks
- One of our major focuses since the beginning of the project has been providing the students with the skills and knowledge to do quality work
- We developed training materials to accomplish that as well as quizzes to assess if individual students are ready



Moving Forward

- Currently working on diversifying the tasks available for the Pathways students to work on
 - Including African Records (specifically from Liberia)
 - Reverse indexing
- 50,000 records/day
- Plans to increase the number of students to 10,000 by the end of the year and expand it out of the eight African Countries and Papua New Guinea
